Celebration Of Black History 365 Days A Year

**What is Black History Month and why do we
celebrate it?**

In the United States, the **month** of February is
observed as **Black History Month** or National
African American **History Month**, and we use
the **month** to remember the important
contributions and achievements of African
Americans throughout our nation's **history**.
The **celebration** can be felt nationally and
worldwide.

What is Black History Month mean to you?
Black History is a time when African-Americans
Can take the time out and see what the people
before them fought for. **Black History** is a time
of rejoicing, celebrating and thanking those
African-Americans for giving us hope or a life
lesson that could be used.

Why was Black History Month created?
Negro **History Week** (1926) the precursor
to **Black History Month** was **created** in 1926 in
the United States, when historian Carter G.
Woodson and the Association for the Study of
Negro Life and **History** announced the second
week of February to be "Negro **History Week**"

What happened in Black History Month?
Black History Month began as Negro **History**
Week, which was created in 1926 by Carter G.
Woodson, a noted **African American** historian,
scholar, educator, and publisher. It became
a **month**-long celebration in 1976. The **month** of
February was chosen to coincide with the
birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham
Lincoln.

How can we celebrate Black History Month?
Learn more about the exceptional contributions
made by African Americans with these ideas for
each day of **Black History Month**. **Celebrate**
Black History Month with these twenty-eight
ideas, one for each day of February, that
recognize the heritage, accomplishments, and
